Building A Beginning Bassline

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MEMORIZE THE CIRCLE OF 5THS AND THE FOUR POSSIBLE APPROACHES

STEP 1: Play the 12 stations of the circle of 5ths counterclockwise (falling 5ths) until memorized and in tune.



<u>STEP 2</u>: Play a 1/2 step approach from below each of the 12 stations until memorized and in tune. The original 12 stations are marked with an accent.



STEP 3: Play a 1/2 step approach from above each of the 12 stations until memorized and in tune. The original 12 stations are marked with an accent.



<u>STEP 4</u>: Play a whole step approach from below each of the 12 stations until memorized and in tune. The original 12 stations are marked with an accent.



<u>STEP 5</u>: Play a whole step approach from above each of the 12 stations until memorized and in tune. The original 12 stations are marked with an accent.



NOW BUILD A BASSLINE

<u>STEP 1</u>: Write the root below each of the chord changes in your progression.



STEP 2: Select one of the four approachs into each of the roots.



<u>STEP 3</u>: Fill the two missing beats in each measure with notes from an appropriate scale that help to define each chord. Edit your choices for the best overall line and memorize.



<u>STEP 4</u>: Improvise variations to this bass line by changing the approaches and/or the notes played on beats 2 and 3 as you work toward constructing solid basslines on the fly.
